Drop Box Hacked!

Last month file-hosting service, Dropbox, informed customers they must change their passwords due to a data breach.



This appears to be a result of the fallout of the major hack on LinkedIn in 2012. Dropbox did not realize the magnitude of the breach and forced relatively few password changes in 2012. Almost 69 million accounts have been affected with information stolen and subsequently traded online.

It's a good idea to use a two step verification process. It appears to make the job of a hacker much more difficult and can be as simple as receiving a text message with a security code.
